Member Spotlight: Gale Rahmoeller

Gale Rahmoeller has a long tenure with the St. Louis Club, having been a member since the early 1980s. And, unlike many members who join the club after having relocated to St. Louis, she has deep roots in the region. She was born and raised in St. Louis and has spent most of her life here.

Gale attended Purdue University to obtain a degree in chemical engineering and returned to St. Louis to begin her career working for Montsanto. She then went on to a career with the Department of Defense, supporting soldiers in several commands and agencies, including Army Aviation. During this time, she also obtained an MBA from St. Louis University.

Gale has always enjoyed the outdoors and thought that skiing might be a way to expand on that interest. She went on her first ski trip to Winter Park with the YMCA in 1980 and heard about the St. Louis Ski Club from some skiers there. She went on her first club trip to Aspen in 1981. In those days, the club was still doing long bus trips and she enjoyed the chance to know the other 40 people on the trip long before they arrived at the slopes.

Since then, she has been on many club trips and has developed many fond memories over the years. These include the trip to Interlaken, Switzerland, in 1990 where she and several other skiers survived three train trips to be able to see the Matterhorn. On a trip to Alveska, Alaska, in 2004, most of the group took a day off from skiing to take a boat ride to see the fjords and animals in Resurrection Bay. During the 2007 trip to Big Mountain (now Whitefish) she enjoyed the experience of doing the 5mile snow shoeing by McDonald Lake in Glacier National Park. In 1993, she went to Banff with the club on her first ski trip to Canada and enjoyed splitting the stay between the Banff Springs Hotel and the Chateau Lake Louise. This gave her the opportunity to experience the history and charm of the area. On a return trip to Banff with the club in 2018, one of Gale's memorable moments was a fourmile ice hike around Johnston Canyon, wearing ice cleats.

Gale's job led her to relocate to Huntsville, Alabama, for several years in the 1990s. She kept her membership with the club and also went on trips with the Huntsville Ski Club to Interlake, Austria and Chamonix, France, and to other American resorts.

While she has always enjoyed skiing with the club, Gale is also fond of other experiences along the way. She has enjoyed hikes, canoe trips, and other get-

Gale has been retired for several years now and that has given her even more opportunities to travel and see more of the natural sights, sounds and animals around the world. Adventures have included African safaris in Botswana, Tanzania and Kenya; and an Arctic expedition for seeing polar bears. She likes to swim and has enjoyed snorkeling while in the Galapagos Islands and in Australia and New Zealand.

Like many long-time members, Gale has been a participant in many memorable club adventures and has a rich history to relate. She seems intent on continuing these endeavors and we look forward to being along on the ride with her.
